1. (10 points) Let R be a ring and let $r \in R$. Show that $(-1_R) \cdot r = -r$. In other words, show that $(-1_R) \cdot r + r = -r$. $r + (-1_R) \cdot r = 0_R.$

$$1_R + (-1_R) = O_R$$

IR + (-1R) = OR (Definition of -1R)

$$\Rightarrow$$
 $(-1_R), \Gamma + \Gamma = O_R (+ is commutative)$

2. (10 points) (a) (5 points) Find the inverse of $2 + 3\sqrt{3}$ in $\mathbb{Z}[\sqrt{3}]/7\mathbb{Z}[\sqrt{3}]$

$$N(2+35) = 4 - 9.3 = -23 = 5 \mod 7$$

$$\rightarrow (2+313)^{7} = (2-313) \cdot 3 = 6-913 = 6+513$$

(b) (5 points) Find the inverse of $2 + 3\sqrt{5}$ in $\mathbb{Z}[\sqrt{5}]/7\mathbb{Z}[\sqrt{5}]$

$$V(2+35) = 4-9.5 = -41 \equiv 1 \mod 7$$

 $(2+35)^{\dagger} = 2-35 = 2+45$
